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OPEN REPORT TO THE HAMILTON BOARD COMMITTEE - MAY 2014

1. Environmental Scan

1.1 SJHH: Nursing Week

May 12-16, 2014 is Nursing Week. Nursing Week is celebrated each year during the week of Florence Nightingale's birthday, founder of modern nursing. It is a time to recognize the year round dedication and achievements of nurses and to increase awareness of their contributions to our health care system. At St. Joe's, multiple celebration events were held throughout the week at each campus and festivities also included the 13th Annual Nursing Excellence Awards Dinner.

1.2 SJHH: Mental Health Morning

May 8, 2014 was the Mental Health Morning breakfast in support of the Mental Health & Addictions Program at SJHH. This event featured Mary Walsh as the keynote speaker who shared her own struggles to reduce the stigma associated with mental illness and addiction.

1.3 SJVD: Staff Appreciation Week

The Villa combined Nurses' Week, Health and Safety Week and Staff Appreciation into one week of activities May 12-16. Multiple celebration events were held throughout the week to recognize all staff and health and safety in-services were offered.

3. Operational Information

3.1 SJHC: Accreditation

SJHC has completed its accreditation on-site survey and has achieved Accreditation with Exemplary Standing. The surveyors were impressed with the steps that SJHC has taken to empower staff to provide exceptional care to clients. We were commended for living our values and the commitment and engagement of our very professional staff. In the area of Quality Improvement & Risk Management, the surveyors noted key strengths being our focus on quality which encompasses everyone at SJHC, from the Board of Directors to the front-line staff.

3.2 SJVD: Walk-abouts

The first round of walk-abouts has been completed and a new schedule created. The walk-abouts have been viewed by staff and Board members as productive and an opportunity for knowledge sharing. The walk-about idea is also going to be used as a "huddle" method to share urgent information especially in preparation of Accreditation.

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3.3 SJHH: West 5th Redevelopment Update

Operational Readiness

- Deferred work from Phase I (mostly landscaping) will be complete by end of June weather permitting
- Operational readiness planning for Phase 2 occupants is well underway. Moves will take place in September 2014
- Demolition of Blocks A, D and C continued through April
- Currently project is on target to meet key Human Capital delivery dates posting of Year 2 PCOP positions has begun

3.4 SJHH: Mindfulness

Mindfulness exercises have been incorporated to start the management meetings. Mindfulness is being incorporated throughout the organization as research has shown it can reduce anxiety and stress and increase empathy, attention and productivity. Some inpatients units have indicated interest in bringing mindfulness training to their units. This is being explored as a potential research project.
