- 3.1 QUALITY COMMITTEE MINUTES, MOTIONS AND REPORT
- The patient story described a patient living with Huntingtons Disease. depression, anxiety and a frequent user of substances such alcohol and stimulants. They have received care from several programs including concurrent disorders and the capacity building team. The ED and PES team has worked with this patient for the past number of years and are a strong advocate for their care. Currently the patient has been referred to a treatment centre in Toronto in the hope that they will attend and get the care they need. Discussion occurred with respect to the reasons for the referral to Toronto.
- Webex presentations on the quality report for Mental Health and Addiction Program, Semi-Annual Incident and Risk Analysis, Quality Improvement Plans and Quality and Safety Metrics Q2 were received.

4.1 REPORT OF CHAIR

4.2 REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT AND **CEO SJHS**

- A. Korstanje attended meetings of the Research St. Joseph's Board of Directors. as well as Research Institute Finance and Audit Committee this month.
- SJHS supported and approved the motion with respect to the construction of the ten bed hospice Margaret's Place.
- A. Korstanie attended a recent meeting of the SJVD Family Council.
- JBG members were thanked for attending the "Advancing Patient, Family and Staff Partnership Event "My Voice Matters" on November 26th.
- JBG members were asked to consider lending their organizational capabilities and participating in the upcoming Around the Bay Road Race 2020.
- Congratulations were extended to W. Doyle and S. Monzavi on their receipt of the Mission Legacy Award 2019.
- On November 26th the Ministry of Health announced that the Hamilton Health Team OHT application has been selected to move forward. Further OHT announcements are expected shortly. It was noted that B. Lauckner will be responsible for the West region.
- In celebration of Spiritual Care Week, all spiritual care team members were invited to a recognition event at the Chancery Office. The week was also a reminder of the phenomenal work and contributions of the Sisters of St. Joseph. An excellent article which highlighted the Sisters work and origins was written by the CBC and circulated two weeks ago.
- An update on ending hallway healthcare and digital health strategy was provided.

4.3.1 Update on SJVD – C. Gosse	 It was noted that SJVD received the Platinum Award for this year's Reader's Choice Awards for the Long Term Care Home of Choice. The SJVD Strategic Plan was launched on November 6th. An Engagement Day was held on November 23rd – this was open to residents and families, and included a travelling "coffee cart" with the executive team for front line staff. Idea is to educate and share information.
4.3.2 Update on SJHC – C. Gosse	 SJHC received the Gold Award in the "Best Home Care Service" category for the Readers Choice Awards. The Strategic Plan for SJHC was launched the week of November 4.
4.3.3 Update on SJHH – M. Farrell	 The Strategic Plan was launched on November 4th. Lots of positive feedback from staff has been received with commentary that the plan "feels like SJHH". The MOH came to meet with the team to discuss ALC – issues, hallway healthcare, potential solutions, etc. Discussion occurred with respect to the community partnership between SJHH and Developmental Services Ontario. It was noted that the research associated with the 3 Wishes Project has shown that the program is successful, powerful and cost-effective. M. Farrell noted that she has had the opportunity to speak to staff who are directly involved with the program and they have noted how meaningful it is not only for the patients and their families but also for the staff. It was noted that further discussion will occur at the Governance Committee and that this item will possibly come forward at a future generative discussion SJHH Charlton Campus was a Diamond and Platinum winner in various categories in the Reader's Choice Awards.
4.4 REPORT OF THE CHIEF NURSING OFFICER	A briefing note on Violence in the Workplace: Strategy to Improve Care and Staff Expertise – Mental Health and Addiction Program Code White Drills was overviewed. This report is an update on one of the strategies SJHH is undertaking to improve care and staff expertise related to Code White.
4.5 VICE PRESIDENT RESEARCH	 Various highlights were provided. Noted that the 40th Anniversary of the Firestone Institute for Respiratory Health was recently celebrated and the event was a tremendous success and it was very gratifying to see former students, many who are now in high ranking positions internationally, attend the event. A search is ongoing for an Executive Director for FIRH. This should be in place by July 2020. Discussion occurred with respect to wording modifications related to Health Canada requirements and clinical research proposals, particularly dealing with pregnancy precautions. SJHH will seek clarity with respect to the pathway for getting permission to make wording modifications if needed and what suitable wording requirements are acceptable. This is being worked through at present. It was noted that understanding the relationship between the Research Institute and the JBG needs to be examined.
4.6 REPORT OF THE CHIEF OF STAFF	 A comprehensive update on the Saudi physician situation was provided. Resident shortages were also discussed. An update on physician wellness and the issues related to wellness in relation to staff and physicians were discussed.

The guest speaker will be Mr. Bill Tholl. The title of the presentation – "Leading 21st Century Healthcare: What's Next for Physicians?" T. Stewart thanked N. Ahuja for all her efforts related to the Health Leadership Program.
SJVD FOUNDATION	 The JBG and Senior Leadership were thanked for their support with respect to the hospice project. Excellent community support and fundraising is occurring at this time. It was noted that the Capital Campaign would be wrapping up shortly and the next area of focus will be on operations and programming. The Neil and Anne McArthur Golf Tournament was held in October and was a resounding success. Road2Hope was held at beginning of November. It is a very inspiring event which involves the participation of residents and recreational therapists. SJVD Gala will be held on April 24, 2020. The theme of next year's Gala will be "Inspired".
SJHH FOUNDATION	 A briefing note on Foundation activities was provided. The 22nd Annual Holiday Gala was a great success and raised a significant amount of funds to assist in the purchasing of vital equipment. The Donor Impact Report was released at the end of October, and five upcoming tours of the Surgical Centre for donors and potential donors.
